A MESSAGE FROM FR. RICHARD

Dear Friends.

The Epiphany season is a moment in time in which we take comfort from the involvement of God in Christ with our everyday life. The Epiphany visit of the 3 kings reveals Jesus as priest who offers life as a gift to God (frankincense); as He makes Himself a sacrifice in death (myrrh); while reigning as King of all creation (gold). The Lord's entire 'curriculum vitae' is in this one feast; and yet the entire season rehearses the events which will show Christ as Divine. (Google 'Book of signs' and the body of John's Gospel will be cut into episodes that reveal the Glory and Divinity of Christ.) All too briefly these episodes are: Changing water into wine, Healing the Roman Official's son, Healing the paralytic, Feeding the 5,000, Walking on water, Healing the man born blind, and the Raising of Lazarus. Christ has owned every dilemma and grief, and shows He is desirous to join us there.

Just a minute ago my computer brought up a file of old photos. I was put in mind of the invisible threads that bind our lives and souls to those close to us; how the pull of affection and regard draws us into shared life that is rich, fulfilling, and dare I say "eternal." Now imagine these snapshots of the life and ministry of Jesus as part of the unfolding sequence of our own histories, to which we are bound with honor and regard as God shares our time and space. When Jesus accepts "Incarnation," it is our history God chooses to enter so our story, and that of God, is now one story. "Epiphany" is the ancient term for "appearing." When God appears, we are all swept up into the dance!! May God Bless you in this Holy Season!! I remain,



2016 Treasurer's Annual Report

Operating Budget

Income: overall income exceeded budget by \$6,478.44. Budget: \$127,074 Actual: \$133,552.44 Why?

- Holy Trinity parishioners are very generous!
- Fundraisers: \$204 over budget.
- Rental income exceeded the budgeted amount by \$1,654, not including the YMCA rent.
- Trust income was up by \$708.
- Other income over budget: checking interest \$630; Other Plate Offering \$4,272, along with other miscellaneous unbudgeted income.

Expenses: overall expenses were more than budget by \$32,086. This figure represents, almost entirely, the fire alarm system, and was paid through an unbudgeted donation from the YMCA and unbudgeted YMCA rent income.

Additionally:

- Many lines were under budget, some because the funds were not needed and others because of frugal spending.
- Oil was significantly under budget, but that money was put into the fuel fund reserve. Because we have a large oil tank we are able to take advantage of buying oil in bulk at a low price.
- The expense figure includes all the capital improvement including expense for the parish hall roof and major brick repair.
- Other lines were intentionally over budget and were paid with reserve funds and income over budget.

Non-operating Budget

The Non-operating Budget contains funds received that are outside of the operating budget and designated or restricted for a particular mission or purpose.

We received memorial donations in 2016 of \$475; \$450 was spent to purchase one station of the cross.

Outreach

- \$360 was sent to Childreach/PLAN to sponsor Nicholas in Kenya.
- The 2016 United Thank Offering was \$753.21.
- The 2nd Sunday loose plate for Food Share was \$334.00 with an additional \$202.50 from the "Souper Bowl" soup sale.
- The mission plate offerings were \$1,261.57, with \$1,263.57 plus \$12.75 from ECW given to various missions (separate report)
- o Parrettie alms given \$3,638.50
- The Rector's discretionary fund inflow for 2016 was \$2,575, with \$2,482 given in alms.

♥Outreach Total \$9,046.53

- YMCA Rental and direct expense will not be budgeted for 2017 and will be tracked under non-operating budget.
