The Daughters of the King, would like to take this time and let you know about what we have been doing since the re-induction of Judy Reich back into our Order. We have been busy in a couple of areas. First, in our study program, we have been reading "Having a Mary Heart in a Martha World". Our discussions have been very interesting and eye-opening. Last month's chapter had us reading about a man whom God asks to carry a load of rocks up a mountain in a wagon. (Sound familiar-Mother Judith's sermon). The man was thrilled to do what His Lord asked of him. Along the way he collected more items to place in his wagon. These were favors to "help" friends he met along the way. At some point, he became overwhelmed and could go no further!! He was exhausted and told Jesus he could not go on. (Do you recognize yourself? We sure did)! God asked the man why he was so tired? The man told Jesus how he was helping his friends. And, as Jesus took the burden of others out of the wagon, the wagon became lighter. Jesus said; "I know that you were trying to help but, when you are weighted down with others' burdens, you cannot do what I have asked." "So, if you would be content to let others carry their own burdens, I will help you with your tasks". This is not to say that God does not expect us to help our brothers and sisters in need but rather to prioritize what we do, so that we will be able to do what God has called us to do. Everyone in this life needs help at some point in their lives. However, if we focus our Hearts & Minds on what Jesus asks us to do, He will help; "My yoke is easy, and my burden is light. I will never ask you to carry more than I will give you the strength to bear. "As you all know, the Daughters have adopted New Hope as the focus of our new mission work. The individuals served by New Hope, (an agency that provides support for women and children leaving situations of domestic violence), did not ask for the situation they are now facing, but we can help them through our donations. In discussion with Christine Gaze, from New Hope, she suggested \$25.00 gift cards to Walmart. This would enable each Mom to get what she needs for a Christmas gift for her children. The Daughters have decided to contribute to the funding of these gift cards amongst ourselves. Christine also gave us a list of the most needed items: Baby wipes, Diapers (all sizes, especially 5 & 6**, college ruled notebooks**, Adult coloring books**, Hooded sweatshirts and sweatpants for teenagers**, sweatpants /sweatshirts(men & women all sizes)**, Hand soap/Listerine/toilet paper*, Paper towels/Paper goods/Plastic silverware** Since The Daughter's have taken on this Mission work as a chapter, we are not soliciting donations from the congregation. but rather updating you on our mission. However, if you feel called to give a donation, please feel free to talk with one of the Daughters. Lastly, we have informational fliers about New Hope that we will be placing in our Church bathrooms and local stores. If you have an idea of a place that we should consider hanging a flier, please speak with one of the Daughters.

HOLY TRINITY ELECTIONS COMING UP IN JANUARY



During our annual meeting in January we will be electing our church lay leadership, vestry members and convention delegates. The vestry thought it would be helpful to review this process so all members have the information to be able to participate in a fully informed way. The elected positions are:

Senior Warden, Junior Warden, Treasurer, Secretary,
Vestry Members and Convention Delegates,
all of who must be confirmed members of Holy Trinity Episcopal Church in good standing.

Senior Warden, Junior Warden, Treasurer and Secretary are one year terms. Each person may choose to stand for re-election for an indefinite number of terms or stand down when they feel it is time to do so. Vestry members serve a three year term. They may choose to stand for re-election for a second three year term but after that they have to go off for at least a year before serving again as a vestry member.

Your current elected leaders are: Lynn Garland, Senior Warden; Susan Howland, Junior Warden; Nancy Waugh, Treasurer; and Jean Frost, Secretary. All are willing to continue to serve and are standing for re-election. The vestry members whose three year term is ending are John Grant and Cat Reith-Lowry. Both are willing and eligible to continue to serve a second term.

All of these positions can be challenged. If anyone has concerns and feels someone else would do a better job, another name can be brought forward in an election challenge for the congregation to decide. We encourage each person to actively consider this information. It is important for the health of our congregation that we have fair and open elections.

We elect two convention delegates; one must be a vestry member and the second any confirmed member of Holy Trinity. Convention delegates serve for one year. In 2025 Delegates attend a two-day convention in early November, that is usually held in a central location around the Springfield area.

To submit a name for any position, just let Pastor Dan or any vestry know.
